Spelling Bee

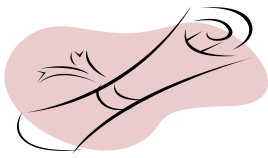

From the Principal's Desk: **What's the Plan**

Life takes us down many different roads and around several turns. As we travel in "our journey", we like to be in control, but we seldom have as much control as we want. When we are affected by influences outside of our control we become uncomfortable and quickly struggle to regain "control" of our lives.

Wouldn't it be so much easier if we could just follow a well published plan that told us how to move in our daily lives? Think of all the people that read their horoscopes to know what to do on a particular day. If you're waiting for a billboard that tells you exactly what to do, you'll be waiting a lifetime. There is, of course, another option. God has plans for each one of us. His plans aren't written and change without our foreknowledge, but He has a specific plan for each of us.

We aren't a static or non-changing participant; we grow, change, and evolve as our faith grows within us. We find the gifts God has given us and begin to find ways to use them in His plan. Our goals turn from self-centeredness to a life where we care about what He would want for us and others. Sometimes we find new gifts and new challenges that He puts in our "road" often in ways we can't ignore.

Our plans are full of flaws. God's plan is perfect. We tend to think first of ourselves. God asks us to follow His example of loving all and loving others first. Maybe I'm wrong but I think God moves our lives in ways that causes us to look at Him and ask how we can move closer to His plan. If possible, and with God's blessings, we move ourselves and others closer to that special plan He has for each of us. What's the plan?
